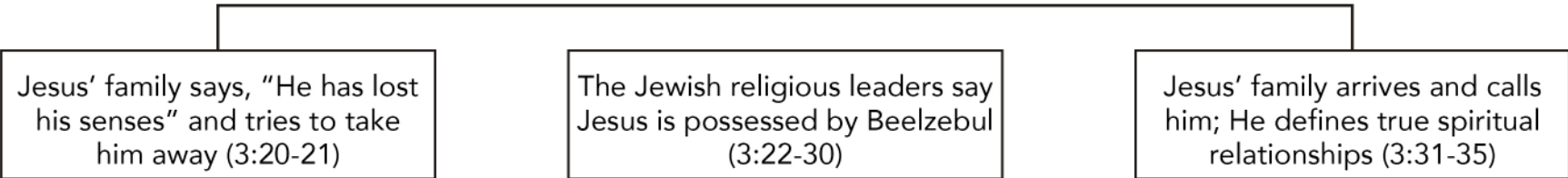

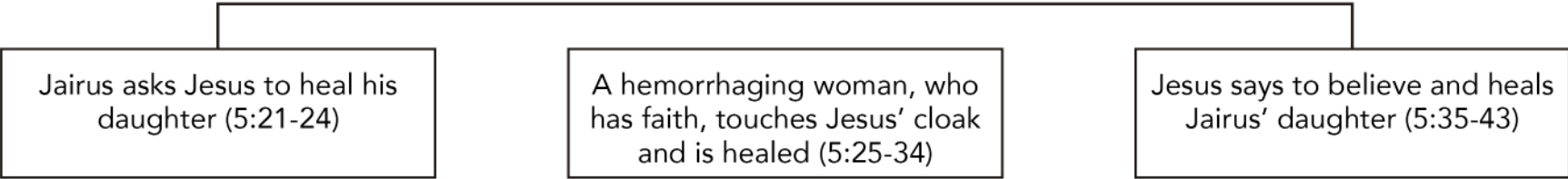
MARK'S INTERCALATION

An intercalation is a literary device where one event is "sandwiched" between the beginning and end of another event. The two events are related to each other and serve to interpret the other.

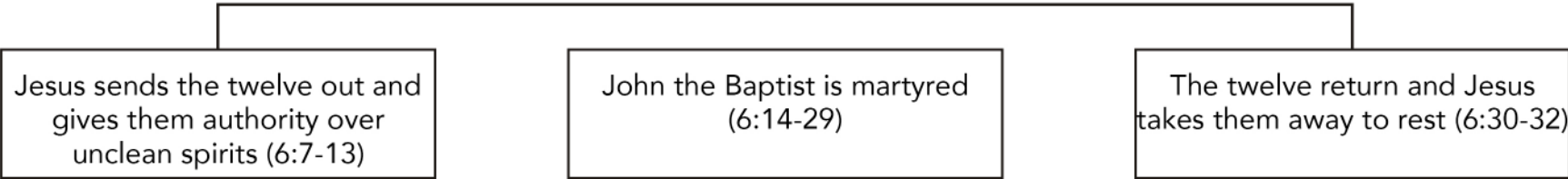
JESUS IS REJECTED BY HIS OWN (Mark 3:20-35)

THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP (Mark 6:7-32)

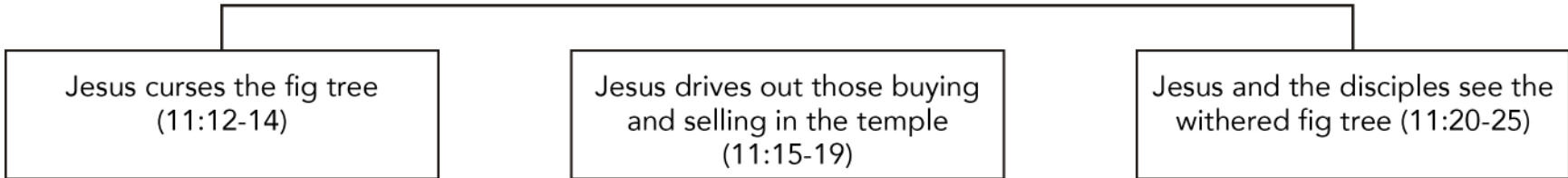

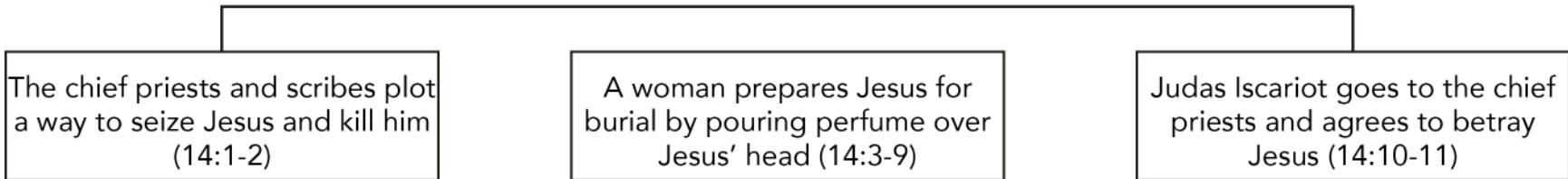
