THE LESSON WE CAN LEARN FROM BARNABAS...

Now Joseph, who was also called Barnabas by the apostles (which translated means son of Encouragement), owned a tract of land. So he sold it, and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet (Acts 4:36-37).

THE LESSON WE CAN LEARN FROM BARNABAS...

When Saul came to Jerusalem, he tried repeatedly to associate with the disciples; and yet they were all afraid of him, as they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took hold of him and brought him to the apostles (Acts 9:26-27).

And Barnabas left for Tarsus to look for Saul; and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. And for an entire year they met with the church and taught considerable numbers of people; and the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch (Acts 11:25-26).

THE LESSON WE CAN LEARN FROM BARNABAS...

The Holy Spirit said, "Set Barnabas and Saul apart for Me for the work to which I have called them." Then, when they had fasted, prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away (Acts 13:2-3).

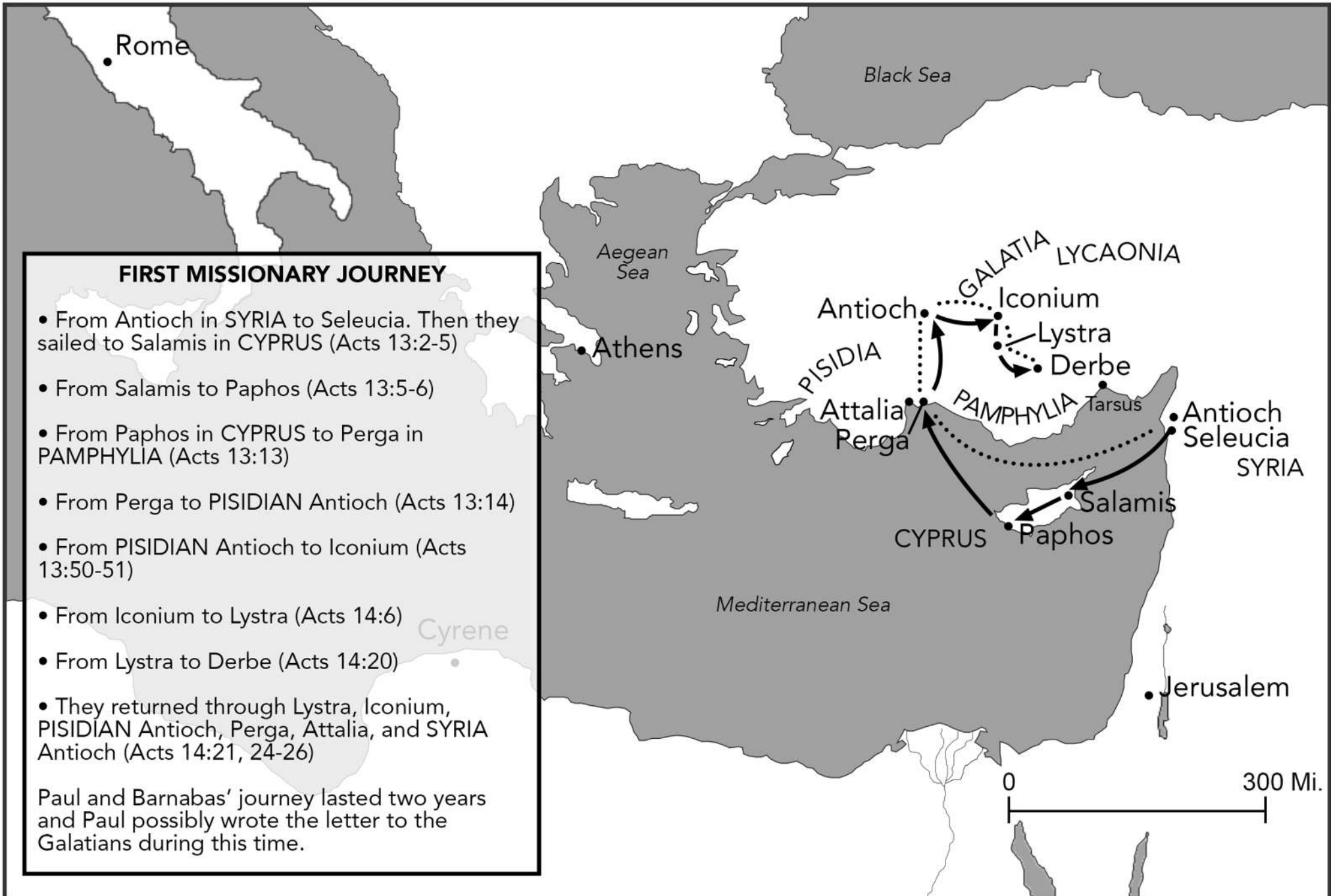
THE LESSON WE CAN LEARN FROM BARNABAS...

As Paul and Barnabas were going out, the people repeatedly begged to have these things spoken to them the next Sabbath (Acts 13:42).

THE LESSON WE CAN LEARN FROM BARNABAS...

All the people kept silent, and they were listening to Barnabas and Paul as they were relating all the signs and wonders that God had done through them among the Gentiles (Acts 15:12).

PAUL'S FIRST MISSIONARY JOURNEY



FIRST MISSIONARY JOURNEY

- From Antioch in SYRIA to Seleucia. Then they sailed to Salamis in CYPRUS (Acts 13:2-5)
- From Salamis to Paphos (Acts 13:5-6)
- From Paphos in CYPRUS to Perga in PAMPHYLIA (Acts 13:13)
- From Perga to PISIDIAN Antioch (Acts 13:14)
- From PISIDIAN Antioch to Iconium (Acts 13:50-51)
- From Iconium to Lystra (Acts 14:6)
- From Lystra to Derbe (Acts 14:20)
- They returned through Lystra, Iconium, PISIDIAN Antioch, Perga, Attalia, and SYRIA Antioch (Acts 14:21, 24-26)

Paul and Barnabas' journey lasted two years and Paul possibly wrote the letter to the Galatians during this time.
